St John's College Trust Board Anglican Student Support Fund Funding Guidelines

For many years the Trust has provided scholarships for students attending Anglican Schools¹ throughout Aotearoa, New Zealand to ensure children can continue their education in situations where whanau/family or the student themselves have encountered unexpected difficulties.

The following criteria and parameters have been established in respect to the consideration and the approval of scholarships:

1. All students attending an Anglican Schools in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia are eligible to receive funding assistance.
2. An application will be considered when unexpected difficulties have arisen that adversely impact the ability of a family/whanau to maintain their child at an Anglican School and a change of school is seen as detrimental to the student.
3. Difficulties can be financial, or family related, e.g. the death or illness of parents, guardians or caregivers.
4. The Trust may also approve a scholarship on purely compassionate grounds.
5. An application must be supported by references from Principal and Chaplain and any support offered by the School will be taken into account as a positive indicator of the school's backing of the student.
6. Financial assistance is available for a maximum of three years for any student with a separate application required for each year.
7. The maximum amount for each application is limited to 50% of the school/boarding fees payable up to a maximum of NZD \$12,000 p.a.
8. The funding awarded will be paid directly to the Student's school. All schools that received funding will be required to provide the Trust with an annual update in respect to the outcome of the scholarships provided.
9. Each application should be supported by as much supporting information and explanations that the student's family/whanau are able to provide.
10. Each application must be supported by a comprehensive Statement of Financial Position of the student's family/whanau or a clear explanation provided why the provision of this information is not possible.
